Current FUSION partner schools need NOT reapply, but ALL partner schools \underline{must} do the following:

1. Sign and return the 2011-12 Memorandum of Understanding (attached/Chicago Public Schools have a different form) no later than April 1, 2011 and submit payment for \$750 per program, payable to IMSA FUSION, to participate for the upcoming academic year. All partner schools must submit, via mail, an original, signed MoU with payment <u>each year</u> to IMSA.

Please note that our annual participation fee for schools has increased due to our growing need to support FUSION schools on a limited, decreased state budget. Participation fees help offset our program costs to deliver FUSION curriculum, lab kits, program evaluation, student incentives and professional development workshops to our Illinois schools.

"Within a conceptual framework, inquiry learning and active learner involvement can lead to important outcomes in the classroom. Students who actively make observations, collect, analyze, and synthesize information, and draw conclusions are developing useful problem-solving skills. These skills can be applied to future "need to know" situations that students will encounter both at school and at work. Another benefit that inquiry-based learning offers is the development of habits of mind that can last a lifetime and guide learning and creative thinking."
