#### Ms. Susan Eddins, Faculty Emeritus 1986-2007

Council of Presidential Awardees in Mathematics, Metropolitan Mathematics Club of Chicago Mathematical Association of America, National Council Teachers of Mathematics This winter Ms. Eddins took a hiatus from consulting work. ## DR. EDWIN GOEBEL, FACULTY EMERITUS 1987-2007

American Society for Microbiology

Dr. Goebel led an Intersession titled "Infectious Diseases as Depicted in Cinema," at IMSA from (January 2014). Ten IMSA students were immersed in the areas of epidemiology and infectious diseases, and they learned about microbiology, host defenses, microbe virulence factors and epidemiology. They viewed and discussed a number of films about infectious diseases: Dr. Ehrlich's Magic Bullet, The Andromeda Strain, Outbreak, Miss Evers' Boys, And the Band Played On and Contagion. They also viewed and discussed videos about polio. influenza (1918) H1N1), and a series about *The Coming Plagues*. Dr. Goebel attended (via FaceTime) the retirement event for IMSA's school nurse, Susan Bernal (5/28/14).

# DR. STEPHANIE PACE MARSHALL, FOUNDING PRESIDENT AND PRESIDENT EMERITA

The role of Stephanie Pace Marshall, as President Emerita, is to "Bring IMSA & Its Work with Her." This work is supported in part by the Discretionary Fund established by the IMSA Fund.

FOUR AREAS OF STRATEGIC ADVANCEMENT AND POSITIONING: (1) promote and expand knowledge of IMSA with innovative and influential leaders; (2) identify opportunities to explore and create connections and partnerships focused on innovation, entrepreneurship and talent development; (3) advance IMSA's leadership and "presence & voice at the table"; (4) connect IMSA to networks and leaders.

#### CONNECTING IMSA TO STATE, NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL INITIATIVES

Ubiquity University: Dr. Marshall is a founding trustee of Ubiquity University, an online university that will launch publically in 2014. It represents a paradigm shift in global higher education by combining a virtual social learning platform for more personalized and collaborative learning with mentoring and problem-solving centers. UU aligns curriculum to the needs of current students and employers, and it makes higher education more affordable. A potential future initiative is the creation of a global high school, and this could create a partnership opportunity for IMSA. UU's chief performance officer and chief marketing and branding officer spent a day at IMSA discussing online learning, R.I.S.E., CoolHub, Ubiquity's platform and collaborating (March 2014).

National I-Steam Academy, South Africa: Dr. Marshall is a founding partner, chief learning advisor and learning experience designer for an international educational design and development consultancy, EDuQ8 INTERNATIONAL, which is chartered in London with an office in Cape Town. Its mission is to catalyze the transformation of education in Africa by

collaborating with universities, educational innovators, not-for-profits and businesses to design transformative schools. The initial development will focus on the design of a national i-STEAM academy and several regional STEM hubs. Dr. Marshall is working with IMSA staff to explore a partnership. John Gilmour, a leader in STEM education in South Africa and founder of six STEM academies near Cape Town, visited IMSA for two days (April 2014). Dr. Marshall and Mr. Gilmour are leading the EduQ8 INTERNATIONAL STEM initiative in South Africa.

IMSA's Innovation Hub: As a member of the advisory committee, Dr. Marshall visited innovation centers at State Farm, the Harold Washington Library and Barrington High School.

2014 Lincoln Leadership Award Recognition Ceremony: Dr. Marshall attended this year's event featuring awardee, Steven Spielberg.
