Research and Cultural Experience in NYC

Our goal is to partner an MSI class with a cohort at the Bronx Science High School to work on a collaborative research project at first remotely during the fall semester, and then conduct another set of tests collectively at the Manne Institute in the Bronx to complete their project. In addition to engaging in this collaboration, we will experience all that NYC has to offer. This will include cultural activities like a Broadway show, museums, and specialty NYC restaurants. We will also try to visit professional/university research labs in the city, particularly those with connections to our current alumni.

We will also have the option of day trips to Cinque Terre (five magical little villages perched on cliffs above the northern coast of Italy) and/or a day tour around Tuscany. Before and during the trip, students will be studying Roman architecture, Italian art history, and the intertwined role of religion and politics in Italian culture.
